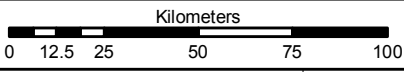
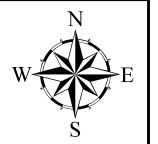
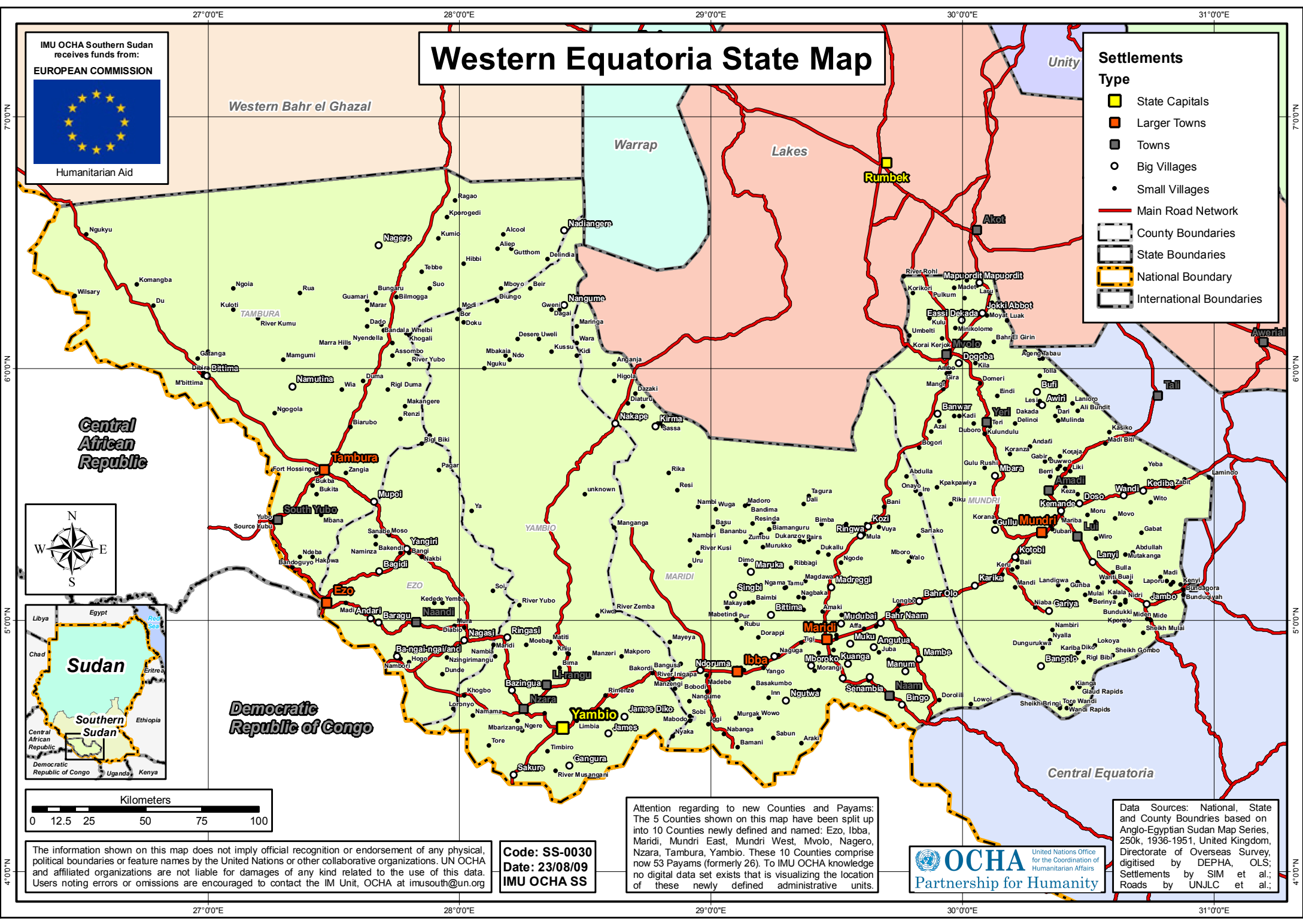

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Attention regarding to new Counties and Payams: The 5 Counties shown on this map have been split up into 10 Counties newly defined and named: Ezo, Ibba, Maridi, Mundi East, Mundi West, Mvolo, Nagero, Nzara, Tambura, Yambio. These 10 Counties comprise now 53 Payams (formerly 26). To IMU OCHA knowledge no digital data set exists that is visualizing the location of these newly defined administrative units.
